Welcome to term 2 in Jolly Pirates.

What is our learning project?

Our learning project this month is 'What do we need?' During this project, we will ask the children what they would like to learn about, some input from the children could include keeping healthy e.g., fruit and vegetables, exercising and brushing our teeth. Over the month of January, we will be researching the quotes from the children to help build their knowledge on this topic. This will be through ICT video clips, story books, discussions during circle time and free play activities.

We will explore what our bodies need including exercise and movement.

What activities might we explore?

The boys and girls will be exploring a wide range of items relating to our topic. We will explore healthy eating as we need to keep our bones and bodies strong, the boys and girls will have the opportunity to make their own vegetable soup, were they will be cutting their own vegetables. Helping to enhance manipulative skills such as fine and gross motor skills. Mathematical skills and language as they count and weigh ingredients. They will hopefully enjoy the soup for snack, fingers crossed! During outdoor play we will explore our planting areas and do a bit of gardening. This will help the children freely explore their immediate surroundings as the explore how vegetables and plants grow through play-based learning.

What might we sing or read? The children will have the opportunity to explore our book corner with peers and staff. They will be able to explore freely throughout the session with topic related books. The books will enhance the children's learning by looking at pictures and staff reading aloud during group story time. This area will have engagement from a staff member to answer any questions the children may have.

During group time the children will learn and sing. Singing songs and looking at books will help children interact socially as they play together.

Our rhyme and song sheet is available to download from our website and is uploaded on Famly.

Additional activities planned?

Due to Covid-19 we are still not permitted to have any school trips off the premises or inside the classroom.

We will be exploring some interactive ICT drama and movement in class.

What skills are we focussing on? During this month we will be helping to develop increasing control of fine motor movements of their fingers and hands, which links to children's emergent writing skills. They will have opportunities throughout the session to play with equipment that can improve their fine motor skills such as building, threading, screwing, pouring, and completing simple tasks such as buttering bread/toast and putting their own coats on and helping to further develop their independence skills.

Home activity ideas:

Each month we encourage children and their families to take part in some home activities. We will share some home activity ideas via Famly. We encourage parents/guardians to engage in these alongside their child to build a school to home link. Some activities will be; Singing our song and rhyme sheet.
