Where to access information.

What is our learning project?

Our learning project this month is ‘what is nature?’ Through this project we may explore activities based around flowers, lifecycles, outdoors, trees, growth, and animals. These ideas will continue to develop throughout the month with input from the children and opportunity for spontaneous learning. Over the course of the month, we will also be exploring the weather and discussing what the children observe. We will continue to look at springtime changes e.g., brighter days. This month we will also explore World Book Day and favourite stories. We will role play and engage in drama activities around our favourite stories.

What activities might we explore?

The children will have the opportunity to explore natural materials such as sticks, shells, flowers and leaves will be available to the children through a variety of activities including painting and table top. The children will have the opportunity to explore natural materials alongside sensory play. We will explore the children’s suggestions of different animals including baby animals. Through the different outdoor environments, we will have the opportunity to explore nature elements, including the weather, different outdoor nature items and planting. We will also be growing some exciting living creatures in the classroom.

What might we sing or read? We will have the opportunity to sing songs relating to nature aspects such as the rainbow song, animal number rhymes (e.g., 5 little speckled frogs) and the children can suggest songs during song and music time. The children will have the opportunity to explore a wide range of books relating to the children's suggestions for the project. Some of these will include 'the hungry caterpillar' and 'the little red hen'. As we will be celebrating World Book Day on Friday 3rd March the children will have the opportunity to bring in their favourite books to share with peers.

Our rhyme and song sheet is available to download from our website and is uploaded on Family.

Additional activities planned?

World Book Day – 3/3/2022 – bring your favourite book to pre-school.

Active hour – 29/3/2022 will be visiting us to engage in an Easter active activity.

Trip – 30/3/23 further details will be on the Family app.

Big Yellow Friday – 31/3/2022 – we will be wearing yellow to Jolly Pirates. All donations greatly appreciated to go towards Children's Liver Disease Foundation.

What skills are we focussing on? This month we will be encouraging the children to develop a further sense of curiosity and exploration. We will encourage them to use their observational skills. In addition, at the snack area, children will have the opportunity to continue to build more independence skills through the preparation of snack, also enhancing their physical skills.

Throughout the environment we will provide opportunities to enhance name recognition skills.

Encouraging children to be able to recognise their own name.
